APS X2 QUIZ - ANSWERS

1. B: No

The IFOA does not regulate firms, only individual members. However, in order to support actuaries in complying with their professional duties in terms of APS X2, it is good practice for firms to carry out periodic file reviews in order to highlight any learning points on how members are implementing APS X2.

2. B: Make their own decision about independent peer review

APS X2 requires members to consider when independent peer review is appropriate and proportionate. If a member feels under pressure from an employer to refrain from having work independently peer reviewed, they should speak up, explaining their duties to the profession.

3. C: Maybe

APS X2 requires that review should be undertaken at a time such as to be capable of influencing the conclusions and outputs of the work. If reviewing work after submission precludes that influence, the member could be in breach of their professional duties.

4. C: Maybe

It is for members to decide when it is appropriate or proportionate for work to be reviewed or independently peer reviewed, but they must be able to justify their approach when reasonably called upon to do so.

5. B: No

Where a member considers that it is appropriate and proportionate for work to be peer reviewed but cannot access appropriate reviewers, they should not submit the work without review. Doing so could amount to a breach of APS X2 and an allegation of misconduct
