Who are they?

Career Ambassadors are members of the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries (IFoA) who give up some of their time to support the promotion of the profession, and the individuals within it. They provide clarity around what an actuary is and the growing list of opportunities available to them.

It is a varied and rewarding role with many different opportunities open, from attending school and university events to providing us with a profile to place in our promotional material.

Who can apply?

Any member of the IFoA who is currently employed. We are keen to secure support from Students, Associates and Fellows. As a Career Ambassador you should be employed and working towards your qualification. You need to be confident enough to be able to talk about your route into the profession and your current role. You should also be in a position to know a bit about the current exam system and how the profession works and what we do.

Many of our volunteer positions offer members the opportunity to gain CPD credit. How does this work?

We currently have over 250 Career Ambassadors based all around the world who help us promote the actuarial profession and those who work within it.
