

IFOA GI Board Criteria for Outstanding Achievement Award

Through the outstanding achievement award, the GI Board seeks to recognise an actuary working in the GI field who has exhibited one or all of the following qualities:

Widespread Influence

They may be recognised for:

- Championing and improving diversity and inclusion in the profession
- Widening engagement in the profession, either by encouraging members to volunteer or attracting new members
- Forging exceptional relationships with other insurance professionals e.g. underwriters, accountants
- Contributing to global actuarial or regulatory matters, influencing policy

Exceptional Accomplishment

They may be recognised for:

- Attaining notable career heights beyond Actuarial that promote the actuarial skillset e.g.
 CEO, government minister
- An outstanding contribution to GI actuarial research, either through developing new methods or applying existing ones to non-standard areas

Exemplary Character

They may be recognised for:

- Acting with notable professional integrity e.g. whistle-blowing
- Showing outstanding leadership characteristics throughout their career and inspiring and developing others to achieve similar success
- Helping develop professional standards within the IFoA, and/or educating others in what is expected

Endurance

They may be recognised for:

- Length of service volunteering for the IFoA
- Length of service working in the Actuarial GI field
- Overcoming significant hardship in reaching career goals
