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# **IFoA** as a Regulator

### Royal Charter

"The objects of the Institute and Faculty of Actuaries shall be, in the public interest, to advance all matters relevant to actuarial science and its application and to regulate and promote the actuarial profession"


- Profession empowered to regulate itself
- Sets codes and standards, provides guidance and education, operates a disciplinary scheme
- Oversight and technical standards setting by Financial Reporting Council in the UK

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# **IFoA's Regulatory Framework**

- The IFoA's existing standards framework is broadly made up of:
  - o the Actuaries' Code
  - o Actuarial Profession Standards (APSs)
  - o Guidance Notes (GNs) and
  - Non-mandatory resource material
- CPD Scheme
- Practising Certificates issued for roles in pensions and insurance
- Quality Assurance Scheme for Organisations
- The FRC produce Technical Actuarial Standards (TASs) for the UK

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### So why is this a positive thing...?

- Regulatory framework protects the reputation of the profession and its members as well as the public/users
- Demonstrates the high level of standards to which IFoA members work
- Promotes quality actuarial work and professional behaviour
- Publications (including regulatory measures) intended to help our members in meeting the standards expected and required of them



# **CPD Scheme Requirements**



- What is CPD?

- Recording
- Evidencing
- In-house CPD events

### CPD is:

Learning which is relevant to the nature of the member's work or role and which addresses a personal development need.

# **CPD Categories**

- Category 1 practising certificate holders
- Category 2 all other fully regulated Fellows and Associates
- Category 3 partially regulated Fellows and Associates
- Category 4 Certified Actuarial Analysts
- Category 5 Students
- Category 6 Student Actuarial Analysts
- Category 7 Retired members
- Category 8 Honorary Fellows and Associates

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# Category 1 – PC holding Fellows

- 30 hours in total
- 20 hours relating to technical learning
- 2 hours of 'professional skills' activities (i.e. Stage 3 PST)
- 4 hours of business skills or additional professional skills
   Must:
- Complete before applying for renewal of practising certificate
- Retain evidence for two years

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### Category 2 - Fellows (non-PC) and Associates

- At least 15 hours of activities
- At least five hours of external events
- Relevant stage of the PST either Stage 2 or 3 Must:
- Complete by 30 June
- Record by 31 July
- Retain evidence for two years

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### **Category 5 - Students**

- No technical skills requirement
- Must complete Stage 1, 2 or 3 of the PST, as relevant

## Must

- Complete by 30 June
- Record any Stage 3 PST activity by 31 July
- Retain evidence for two years



# **Evidence of learning activities**

### Evidence is:

Written evidence of participation in the CPD activity recorded which includes but is not limited to:

- A signed register of attendance
- A certificate of vouching for the completion of a course or activity
- Hard copies of lectures or presentations delivered by the member
- · Articles or papers written for publication
- Written confirmation from a provider of an on-line resource.

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### **APS X2: Review of Actuarial Work**

- Cross practice standard
- No geographic restrictions
- Applies to all types of members
- Principles, not rules, based
- In force since 1 July 2015



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# The requirements

- Requirement to consider applying Work Review to Actuarial Work for which a Member is responsible
- Requirement to consider, in particular, whether Work Review should take the form of Independent Peer Review
- Presumption that the Member should, to the extent appropriate and proportionate, ensure that Work Review is applied



- Consider
  - Must apply one's mind to the issue
  - Factors set out in Para 1.3
- Work Review

"Process by which a piece of Actuarial Work ... is considered by at least one other person for the purpose of providing assurance as to the quality of the work..."

- o Intentionally wide
- o Spectrum of types of review
- o May be review by a non-actuary

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# **Key Terms**

- Independent Peer Review
  - o Form of Work Review
  - o Specific requirements for individuals carrying out the review
  - o Not otherwise involved in the work AND
- Would have had the appropriate expertise
- Appropriate and proportionate
  - Objective test
- Should apply...
  - Presumption that it will be applied unless there are circumstances to justify another approach

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# Requirements broken down...

Actuarial Work

"Work undertaken by a Member in their capacity as a person with actuarial skills on which the intended recipient of that work is entitled to rely. This may include carrying out calculations, modelling or the rending of advice, recommendations, findings or opinions"

- Broad definition
- May include unpaid work, academic work, non-executive work
- Falling within definition doesn't necessarily equate to a review process being applied... requires 'consideration' of it and may trigger presumption.

# **Specific requirements**

- Must take place at a time capable of influencing the conclusions and outputs of the work ("hot")
- Clarity of roles for those involved in the process
- Must be in a position to justify the approach taken




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
### **New TAS Framework**


- FRC review of the TAS framework for the UK
