THE RECENT TREND OF MORTALITY IN ENGLAND AND WALES

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In continuation of the tables given on pp. 99–100, the central death rates in age groups for males and females separately in the year 1939 are shown in Table 1, and the ratios of these death rates to the corresponding rates for the years 1930–31–32 are shown in Table 2. In the case of males, both the deaths and the populations from which the death rates have been derived are limited to civilians.
