The average attendance at home meetings was 84, which is lower than last year. However, there were more meetings held this year, one or two of which were of a specialist nature, and there were over 100 present at five of the meetings. On 15 January 1985 the Society welcomed members of the Royal Statistical Society and on 14 May members of the London Chartered Accountants Group. The meeting held on 21 May was a joint meeting with the Institute of Actuaries.

A national tour was organized, in which R. J. Myers visited three provincial actuarial societies, as well as the Students' Society, to speak on "Actuaries and the Social Security Program in the U.S.A".

A meeting was held for liaison purposes with the secretaries of other actuarial societies in Great Britain and Ireland.

3. Accounts

The Accounts show the Society to be in a very satisfactory financial position. Subscriptions and interest income taken together are a little more than sufficient to cover basic expenses, including the Journal and Society meetings. Social events and Courses are very close to break-even, while FIASCO continues to provide the Society with good additional income. This income is being put to work in a variety of enterprising projects, several of which will mature during the coming 75th Anniversary Year. It has also enabled the General and Contingency Reserves to be built up to provide a secure underpinning for the Society's many activities.

4. Post-Qualification Studies and Courses

The Society ran an Effective Speaking Course in October 1984, a Marketing Course in February 1985 and two Life Office Taxation Courses, one in November 1984 and one in February 1985. A non-life Computer Game was again organized, primarily to assist those studying for the General Insurance examination.

5. Publications and Research

Volume 28 of the Journal was published under the joint editorship of D. E. Purchase and P. J. Cooper. In February 1985 P. J. Cooper was granted leave of absence from editorial duties and A. Saunders was appointed as an editor.

The Society's magazine, FIASCO, had a successful eighth year of publication under the editorship of P. W. Thompson.

The Society's thanks are due to the editors of both the Journal and FIASCO. A Society prize was awarded to R. Owen and P. S. Shier for their paper "The

A society prize was awarded to R. Owen and P. S. Shier for their paper. The Actuary in Damages Cases—Expert Witness or Court Astrologer?" which was presented to the Society on 5 March 1985.

The Society continued to be represented on the Research Committee, Sessional Meetings Committee, Medals and Prizes Committee, Post Qualification Courses Sub-Committee and Historical Texts Sub-Committee of the Institute. The Society, in conjunction with the Institute, continues to support the fund for the purchase of historical actuarial texts for the Institute library.

The Society has been active both in discussing accounting and presentation of pensions and general insurance. Following last year's annual meeting of GIRO, the Students' Society formed a Committee with YCAG with the aim of producing recommendations which were actually discussed at a meeting on 14 May 1985. The paper and discussion received wide publicity, both in the national and insurance press.

6. Social

Buffet suppers were held at a local public house following sessional meetings and were generally well attended.

The Annual Supper was held at the London Press Centre on 28 September 1984 following the Annual General Meeting, and was attended by 329 members and guests. The principal guest was S. P. L. Kennedy, Senior Vice-President of the Institute.

The seventeenth Golf Meeting with the Gallio, Fellowship and 59 Clubs took place at the Royal Mid-Surrey Golf Club on 20 June when 18 members represented the Society. The Gal Fell Bowl was won by the Society.

A number of successful social and sporting events were arranged, including a dinner-dance at the London Hilton on 1 March 1985 which was attended by the President of the Institute. The Summer Social Event (a Mediaeval Banquet) was held at Ivory House, St Katharine's Dock on 29 June 1985. A Five-a-Side Football Tournament was held on 2 September 1984 and a Squash Tournament

was held during the autumn. A Darts Tournament was held on 17 January 1985 and a Winter Wander through historic parts of London tested members' resourcefulness on 15 February.

The Society was represented at meetings of kindred societies by M. D. Moule who was entertained by the Manchester Actuarial Society, G. J. Wardle by the Faculty of Actuaries Students' Society, R. C. Wilkinson by the Birmingham Actuarial Society and the Bournemouth Actuarial Society, and R. P. Burrows by the Glasgow Actuarial Students' Society and the Bristol Actuarial Society.

7. Administration

The Committee thanks D. E. Purchase for his advice and help during the year as the member appointed by Council. The Committee is also most grateful for the encouragement and support which it receives from the President, members of Council and other senior actuaries and particularly wishes to thank those who took the chair at the Society's meetings.

The Committee very gladly records its appreciation of the essential part played in the administration of the Society by Mr Mackie and the staff at the Institute Office.

8. 75th Anniversary of the Society

This year the Society celebrates its 75th anniversary on 23 November. To mark this occasion the Society has planned a number of activities, including a reception on 22 November to which all past officers of the Society have been invited. At the reception the Society will be presenting two stained glass windows to the Institute of Actuaries. Also Colin Stewart's sequel to Menzler's "The First Fifty Years" will be published. The book is entitled "The Students' Society Log 1960–1985: Twenty Five Years of Enterprise".

The Society has commissioned another book, "A Ramble through the Actuarial Countryside" by F. M. Redington and edited by G. F. Chamberlin. The book contains the collected papers, speeches and essays of F. M. Redington and will be available to members in the spring of 1986.

An exhibition of the historical actuarial books which the Society has financed jointly with the Institute has been arranged for 14–25 November.
