THE RECENT TREND OF MORTALITY IN GREAT BRITAIN

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In continuation of the tables given in J.I.A. 92, 347, central death-rates for Great Britain in the year 1966 and the ratio of those rates to the corresponding rates for the years 1960-62, which, beginning with last year's article, are now taken as the standard, are shown in Table 1. In calculating the mortality rates, the deaths are those recorded as occurring in Great Britain in the year and the population used is the 'home' population at mid-1966, i.e. the number of people actually in the country at the time, as estimated by the Registrars General of England and Wales and of Scotland.

The tables show that mortality in Great Britain in 1966, though lighter than in the standard period 1960-62, was heavier than in either 1964 or 1965; the standardized rates for all ages combined were between 1% and $1\frac{1}{2}\%$ higher than in 1965. For males the all-ages rate in 1966 was only $1\frac{1}{2}\%$ less than the 1960-62 standard and 9% less than in 1950-52; for females it was 6% less than the 1960-62 rate and $18\frac{1}{2}\%$ less than the 1950-52 rate, thus showing clearly the greater rate of improvement in female mortality. In both 1965 and 1966 infantile mortality, for both sexes, was 15% less than the average of 1960-62.

In order that the trend of mortality rates may be conveniently studied, standardized group death-rates for 1930–32, 1950–52 and for each year from 1956 to 1966 are set out in Table 2, and the ratios to the 1960–62 standard are given in Table 3; the ratios for 1956 to 1966 are also shown graphically. The age-groups now used are five in number—under age 1 (infants), 1–14 (children), 15–44 (younger adults), 45–64 (the middle-aged) and 65 and over (the elderly). The group death-rates and ratios have been standardized on the age-distribution of the Great Britain population at the 1961 Census so as to eliminate the effect of changes in the age-distribution of the population.




Fig. 1. Ratios of standardized group death-rates to 1960-62 rates—children and young adults




Fig. 2. Ratios of standardized group death-rates to 1960-62 rates—older adults and all ages
