"Task" Specification

The volunteer will be required to:

- help finalise the research taxonomy and assist with its ongoing maintenance by providing expert opinion
- assist with the tagging of research outputs where required including application of taxonomy terms and keywords
- input into the general approach to organising and displaying the IFoA repository of research.

Tenure

There is no particular tenure associated with this appointment but work is expected to complete by the end of 2019.

Time commitment

The expected time commitment for this role is no more than one to two hours per month.

"Person" Specification

Candidates will ideally have the following skills and experience:

- an understanding of the research landscape in which actuaries work
- relevant actuarial subject knowledge and a strong interest in any of the traditional practice areas and / or related academic fields
- experience of using online platforms, digital tools and / or web content editing
- the ability to understand issues around online user experience and information retrieval and suggest improvements to associated processes.

In return, the volunteer will:

- help to change the way that members, researchers and the wider community of interested parties find and use actuarial research produced by the IFoA
- be provided with excellent professional support and assistance.
