"Task" and "Person" Specification

"Task" Specification

As a member of the Life Board the tasks will include:

- taking on responsibility for one strand of the board's activity and driving this forward, ensuring you report back to the board
- becoming familiar with the Terms of Reference of the board and helping drive the outputs of the board to support the community
- fostering a sense of community amongst members in the practice area, in the UK and internationally
- identifying emerging issues, including horizon scanning, and 'hot topics' of relevance to the practice area
- attending board meetings prepared and armed with ideas for current agenda items, hot topics, themes and content.

Reporting:

You will report in to the Chair, and ultimately to Management Board.

Tenure

This is a three year appointment.

Time Commitment

The time commitment is one day per month (though less in summer). This will be made up as follows:

- attendance at five board meetings per year. Four of these meetings are held in London and one is held in Edinburgh. Attendance may be by conference call
- attendance at possible additional meetings, in respect of the special responsibility allocated to you
- undertaking follow up actions, between meetings.

"Person" Specification

Members of the board will be selected by the current Chair together with a senior member of the Executive staff and approval will be required by Management Board. He or she will be someone who:

- is a Fellow or Associate of the IFoA
- ideally, has an excellent network and profile in the Life practice area
- has a broad understanding of Life matters in the wider context of the profession
- has a collegiate approach and a desire to foster a sense of community amongst members of the board and to deliver a service which benefits members in the UK and internationally
- will network on behalf of the IFoA to keep abreast of emerging issues, including horizon scanning and 'hot topics' of relevance to the practice area
- will be proactive
- has experience in an international context, particularly in relation to the work of the IAA and AAE, as it would be desirable for some members of the Board to have this experience.

In return, the volunteer will:

- be able to influence and contribute to the practice area at a policy level
- be provided with excellent professional support and assistance during your tenure on the committee
- · develop an effective network of contacts across the industry.
