#### Test your connection

##### STEP ONE: Making sure you have the right device and browser software

Visit <http://actuaries.multichanneltv.com/live/test.php> Please do this on the device and the network connection you intend to view the live broadcast on.

Also we strongly recommend you complete the tests well in advance of the 27<sup>th</sup> April since there won't be any technical support available on broadcast day itself. Any issues will need to be resolved beforehand.

You should see a blue IFoA branded title slide and then the broadcast should change to a playing video or a vertical colour test bars. If you are on a mobile device you will just see the title slide and will have to click on the video play button. This is because videos don't start automatically on mobile devices.

If the above appears correctly then you have the correct software on your device to watch the live broadcast. Move onto STEP TWO to test your network connection to see if you have enough bandwidth to view it without buffering.

If you don't see the video or hear anything, move into the FAQs to help diagnose what the problem may be. Resolve them and then retake STEP ONE

##### STEP TWO – Make sure you have enough bandwidth to view the live broadcast without buffering

Visit <https://www.multichanneltv.com/client-checks/>

Have a look at the results. You should have at least 512Kbps (0.5 mbps) per second for a reliable live broadcast without buffering. If the check has shown lower than this, you will experience buffering issues and you should consider an alternative connection.

For instance, if you do experience slow playback and buffering when playing videos at work, you may like to view the live broadcast from a home PC or a mobile 4G connection, as these often deliver more network bandwidth than corporate networks.

#### FAQs/Helping you to diagnose issues

Will my network firewall/IT department allow me to see the live broadcast?

It should do yes, we are broadcasting in the same way that you would view a webpage, port 80. If you can't see the video or testcard then please contact your IT support department and they can liaise with our tech support team by email at [support@multichanneltv.com](mailto:support@multichanneltv.com).

Do I need Adobe Flash to see the live broadcast?

It's an advantage, since it's one of the streams we are providing, but not essential since we are broadcasting

in other more modern formats too. Most modern browsers support html5 video without the need for the Flash plugin. Ensure you have one of the browsers below and Flash won't be an issue.

Will I need speakers or headphone on my device?

Yes, you will in the normal way. If you see a video or test colour bars but don't hear anything contact your IT support department, since this will either be a device or a proxy/citrix issue.

Can I watch it on mobile tablet and phone devices?

Yes you can. Just make sure you have the correct browser (see below)

What browser do I need?

- Firefox 37 and above
- Internet Explorer 10 and above – Flash enabled
- Chrome 42 and above
- Safari 7.1 and above
- Safari for iPad/iPhone (iOS) 7.1 and above
- Opera 29 and above
- Chrome for Android tablets and phones - 42 and above

Please note that the native Android browser is not supported - use Chrome 42 and above for Android phones and tablets

Can I view the live broadcast full screen?

Yes, you can. You'll be able to click the full screen icon in the bottom right of the player controls. This is useful if more than one of you are sharing the screen. Ensure you have a good network connection for good quality full screen streaming.

Will I be able to see an on-demand version afterwards if I miss the live broadcast

Yes you will. An on-demand version of the event will appear on the website a short while after on the live broadcast has finished.

### **STEP 3: WATCHING THE LIVE BROADCAST - ON THE DAY**

The link for the live broadcast is above. The live broadcast will start just before 18:00 GMT and end at around 19:30 GMT. You'll just need to provide your email address to login and to claim 1.5 hours CPD for watching.

For the first time we are introducing live 'playback' of the stream. Much like your PVR at home you can 'rewind' the live stream, so if you join late for any reason you can watch it as 'live'. Please remember that if you do this any live tweets won't be in sync with the video.

You can return to the live stream at any point by clicking the LIVE button in the player controls.
